
### DREAMSCAPE

Dreamscape is simultaneously a canvas and projection screen, creating an interactive game of 'trace the dot'. When first installed, the canvas is blank, and as more visitors trace the dot, an underlying image slowly reveals itself.

The animation projected and its accompanying sound piece take us through a looping journey of death and rebirth.

Eden. is a 9-minute loop displayed across two sculptural screens. Each character's video performance plays out simultaneously, and rather than instructing the gaze of the viewer through the scene, the characters capture attention through sound, gesture and physical expression – their "tastes," each holding within them a symbolic or cultural significance that in turn carry embedded histories and presents of representations and power relations.


### GIRL D\*CK ENERGY

Without any regard for her own grief, Mara navigates the tumultuousness of her life in the wake of a very interesting realisation - it's quite possible that she has become a sex addict.

### JODOT

Isolde Fenton, Tommy Harris

Grá is sick. With what, she's not sure. But it's there, absolutely. Definitely. Maybe. IN A BAD WAY is a darkly comic show about hypochondria.

Following a young woman named Grá waiting in a walk in GP's office, this onewoman show written and performed by Isolde Fenton follows Grá's panic about different symptoms and the respective moments in her life when she began experiencing them. From dancer Kanako Nakajima and artist Mick O'Shea, Kuu is an improvisation performance using the technique of Butoh, a dance style originating in Japan after WW2, a dance that concentrates on the here and now, without being stuck in the past or future.

The sound will be improvised on self made instruments and will be played in dialogue with the dance, where the symbiotic relationship is equal and interdependent.

### HOW DO YOU FEEL?


#### Chris McShane & Daniel Lukas

By the end of the night, you'll feel like a true Corkonian.




A Youth Theatre Short Play MiniFesti


